## **Meeting Minutes**

# September 26<sup>th</sup>, 2013

\*Guest speaker Bob Jacobs from the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, Warmwaters Fisheries Division was present to give a brief presentation on new directions for Bass management in Connecticut.

- A trend toward increasing catch-and-release in bass fishing has resulted in very low harvest rates among bass
  populations in Connecticut. As a result, traditional bass management strategies such as length and possession
  limits have become less effective in improving bass fisheries. Despite the fact that fewer anglers are keeping
  any of the bass they catch, bass populations in public lakes still tend to contain smaller, slower-growing bass
  than populations unfished or lightly fished waters.
- New research has revealed that fishing can significantly affect the genetic makeup of a bass population, producing fish that are inherently slower growing, less active and aggressive, and harder to catch.
- This presents an exciting new possibility that the genetic makeup of fished bass populations might be enhanced through supplemental stocking of bass from unfished water supply reservoirs.
- A cooperative study between DEEP Inland Fisheries and UConn was initiated in 2012 to assess the possibilities.
