- LADSON, S.C. For Immediate Release March 22, 2018 -- Expanding the qualifications to include both graduating high school seniors and those already enrolled in undergrad and graduate programs, Shimano North American Fishing, Inc. will now award up to \$30,000 in scholarships as part of its 'Shimano Varsity' program. The expansion of the program was officially announced to state DNR professionals and bass club leaders by Shimano Youth Fishing Director Frank Hyla at the biannual B.A.S.S. - For their studies beginning in fall 2018, Shimano will award up to fifteen (15) \$2,000 scholarships to U.S. and Canadian high school seniors, college undergraduate and graduate students who are members of B.A.S.S., and majoring in biology, fisheries, wildlife or a natural resource related field. A specially selected panel, including Shimano's Phil Morlock, B.A.S.S. Conservation Director Gene Gilliland, and Chris Horton with the Congressional Sportsman's Foundation, will determine the scholarship winners. Application forms with a May 31 deadline are available on the Shimano website at Shimano Varsity Program Scholarship.
